

Improvement works to start at High Cross Street

Works will start on Monday 8th September for six weeks in the area around High Cross Street near Heathcoat Street, Hockley to make significant improvements to pavements.

These improvements are part of a programme of works to support economic growth in the Creative Quarter. The Creative Quarter programme is funded by Nottingham City Council and the European Regional Development Fund (ERDF).

The pavements will be widened near the Evangelical Church and resurfaced with new paving for its entire length, new pedestrian dropped crossings will be provided to improve access along the street. This particularly benefits disabled people and those using pushchairs and mobility scooters.

These improvement works are part of the Heathcoat Street area proposals which will be carried out in several phases over the coming months up to April 2015. The second phase of the works is scheduled to start in September 2014 on Heathcoat Street.

To carry out the work on High Cross Street some temporary arrangements will be required including:

- Removal of the pay & display parking bays on the southern side of the road for the duration of the works.
- A no stopping restriction will be set up on both sides of High Cross Street; this will mean that all vehicles except permitted vehicles will be unable to stop here. Permitted vehicles will be those local businesses that need to load and unload.

Nottingham City Council would like to thank local residents and businesses in advance for your patience and cooperation whilst the works are taking place. Access to businesses and off street parking will always be maintained. We will try to incorporate any special requirements wherever possible.
