## Arkwright Walk proposals November 2016

### Works to create direct links for pedestrians and cyclists between the city and Trent Bridge

As part of the plans to regenerate the Arkwright Walk area of the Meadows approved by the City Council in 2015, works are currently taking place to reinstate a historic link on Arkwright Walk to provide a through route for pedestrians and cyclists between the city centre and Trent Bridge.

Construction started this week to reopen the road between Bridgeway Hall Methodist Church and Crocus Fields Children's Centre. The works follow on from the recent changes to the Children's Centre and involves creating a new road layout. It will be necessary to remove two trees and a wall to improve safety, lighting and to resolve issues with uneven ground caused by the tree roots, however a new green area will be created and consideration will be given to replacing the trees. Bollards will also be installed to prevent vehicle access along the path and provision of new street lighting will be put in place. The new access will be constructed to enable use by local bus services in the future.

There should be no impact on pedestrian or vehicle access to properties and establishments on Arkwright Walk whilst works are carried out. A location plan of the construction area is overleaf.

The scheme is to improve connectivity between the city and the train station with Trent Bridge for pedestrians and cyclists, improve local access by better integrating the neighbourhood with the surrounding areas and attract visitors into and through the area. It will complement the continued regeneration of the Meadows that has included the NET Phase Two tramline, improvements to the library and Embankment and new housing. Works are expected to be completed by **Sunday 18<sup>th</sup> December 2016**.
